## A one day itinerary showcasing the best food in the North Cotswolds

Stay at the Kingham Plough - Daylesford Organic - Huffkins - Juri's Tearoom - Pudding Club

- Visit the Daylesford Organic farm shop Daylesford, Nr Kingham, Gloucestershire, GL56 0YG.
- Visit Huffkins, the finest bakery in the Cotswolds The Square, Stow-on-the-Wold, GL54 1AB
- Take afternoon tea in Juri's, an award-winning tearoom -High Street, Winchcombe, GL54 5LT.
- Experience the Pudding Club a mouth-watering feat comprising seven different traditional puddings at the Three Ways House Hotel, Mickleton, Near Chipping Campden, GL55 6SB.

**8.00am** – Have breakfast at The Kingham Plough, who have a listing in the Good Pub Guide and a Michelin Bib Gourmand award. They offer a full English breakfast with local produce including homemade jams, all served on the terrace. B&B from £90 per room.

**9.00am** – Daylesford Organic Farm Shop. Daylesford's staff are passionate about organic food and everything in their shop comes straight from their farms. Here you will find a selection of local cheeses, meat, fish, wine and even a cooking school and spa.

Ask a member of staff about special offers on workshops and treatments in the Hay Barn Spa if staying at the Kingham Plough.

**10.30am** – Visit Stow on the Wold – Spend some time exploring the town and visit Huffkins Tearoom, a family run bakery and tearoom, serving delicious teas, coffees and a range of hot and cold meals throughout the day.

11.30am – Via the beautiful villages of Upper & Lower Slaughter, then travel to Cheltenham. Here you will find some of the finest restaurants in the Gloucestershire, such as the Daffodil and Le Champignon Sauvage. There are also many food shops to visit; The Cheeseworks is not to be missed as it is recognised as one of the finest British cheesemongers.

**1.00pm** – Travel to Winchcombe – spend time exploring the town and visit Juri's Tearoom, another award

winning and popular tea room in the Cotswolds run by a Japanese family who fell in love with the tradition of afternoon tea.

**4.30pm** – Visit Chipping Campden – explore the shops and history of this lovely market town. Visit the 16<sup>th</sup> Century Market Hall originally used for the sale of butter and cheese.

**6.30pm** — Book a place at the Pudding Club at the Three Ways House Hotel. This is a popular event which is devoted to preserving the tradition of the great British pudding. If not, have a meal at the Ebrington Arms in Ebrington, an historic pub full of character and local, homemade food.
